MBK OHIO LEADERSHIP DAY

On August 31st, 2022, MBK Ohio partnered with the Cincinnati Reds to host the second annual MBK Ohio Leadership Day. 150 students and 50 chaperones from across the state of Ohio gathered at the Great American Ballpark. Chapters from Mansfield, Columbus, Dayton, Cincinnati, Lincoln Heights, and Springfield gathered to celebrate the great American pastime.

Students met with U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown and Cincinnati Mayor Aftab Pureval, who spent the afternoon talking to students about their schools and futures.

The day-long MBK Ohio Leadership event included tours of the Great American Ballpark stadium, Reds Hall of Fame Museum, and National Underground Railroad Freedom Center.

EARN TO LEARN

In alignment with the MBK milestone of ensuring students graduate college and career ready, The City of Columbus - My Brother's Keeper Village program offered 200 students paid internships in the areas of business, entrepreneurship, fashion, film, and content creation.

Programs included OSU's Business Summer Residental Camp, Columbus Urban League's VLOG, and many more.

SAFETY CITY

In a partnership between The City of Columbus Department of Neighborhoods and Nationwide Children's Hospital, the one-week, 4-day session, was filled with active learning and featured a safety village. Upon completion of the program, each child earned a Certificate of Achievement and participated in a graduation ceremony.

Safety City is a safety education program for children ages 5, 6, and 7 living in the City of Columbus. The curriculum includes topics such as fire safety, vehicle and pedestrian safety, bike safety, stranger awareness, and internet safety, and more.





DISTINGUISHED MALES AND FEMALES OF COLOR

The Distinguished Males / Females of Color programs was created to affirm, enhance, enlighten and inspire young men and women of color. MBK leader Dr. Stacy Worley is the coordinator for the Dayton Public Schools program. Students in grades 4 through 12 are connected to life coaches and mentors, engaged in activities and workshops, and supported through scholarships.

ANNUAL GOLF CLINIC

Dayton Public Schools in partnership with the Distinguished Males / Females of Color programs and MBK Dayton hosted the Annual DPS Office for Cultural Engagement and Inclusion Coed Golf Clinic on September 18th.

Students learned the basics of this timeless sport, including golf grip, swing, putting, chipping, and driving the ball.


- **Teen Suicide Prevention Workshop** led by Clinical Psychologist Dr. Kathy Burlew took place on **Saturday, September 24**

MBK LEADERSHIP: SUMMER EMPLOYMENT

Monica Jones a Realtor, Capital Investor, and Entrepreneur in the Youngstown area spoke to the leadership students about the importance of maintaining your credit and building capital. Students learned about purchasing property and building generation health.

WEALTH ACHIEVERS

MBK Cincinnati completed its first Wealth Achievers program in Aiken High School where they were able to deliver up to \$1,000 in individual scholarships to 16 young men. This program included partnerships with The Cincinnati Reds, Fifth Third Bank, Xavier University, Miami University's E-Gaming Team, UC Health, and The NURFC. They will continue the programming with the hope of adding additional schools to next years cohort.





AMERICORPS VISTA PROGRAM

With support from AmeriCorps, the federal agency for volunteering and service, MBK Ohio is working with community partners across the state to improve the effectiveness of statewide programmatic coordination in education and workforce development for low-income youth and their families in the following MBK Ohio chapter communities: Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton, Lima, Lincoln Heights, Mansfield, Springfield, Stark County, Summit County, Toledo, and Youngstown.



VISTA ANNOUNCEMENTS

- As of August 14, 2022, VISTA member living allowance stipends were raised from \$15,002 to \$17,600.
- Beginning October 1, 2022 the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award will increase to \$6,895 to align with the Pell Grant maximum amount. All VISTA members enrolled on or after 10/01/2022 will earn the increased Segal Education Award amount.

VISTA LEADER HIGHLIGHT: DR. ANDREA GUICE

Dr. Andrea Guice was one of MBK Ohio's first AmeriCorps VISTA members, serving for the MBK Lima chapter since June 2019. In July 2022, Dr. Guice was selected to serve as our project's first-ever VISTA Leader.



The AmeriCorps VISTA Leaders program is open to members who have completed at least one year of full-time service with AmeriCorps or Peace Corps. Leaders work to expand and build capacity of individual members, guiding at least six members through their year of service.

Dr. Guice is a graduate of Lima Senior High School and received an undergraduate degree in Organizational Management from Bluffton University, an MBA from Tiffin University, and a Doctorate of Education from Bowling Green State University. Dr. Guice is an avid researcher and grant writer, with experience in both quantitative and qualitative research methodologies, national conference presentations, and facilitating leadership, pre-service mentoring, intercultural competency and school improvement professional development workshops.
